

Trainees will gain experience laying and cutting brick, stone and concrete blocks in various construction settings. They will also learn about masonry systems and how to construct and repair various structures including walls, arches and fireplaces. Trainees will be taught to use several hand and power tools that bricklayers use daily, and enhance their trowel and hammer skills.

During the apprenticeship, trainees will learn mathematical calculations as well as proper use of measurement, layout, and leveling tools required in the cement finisher trade. Cement Finishers work on a wide variety of vertical and horizontal surfaces and structures such as concrete floors, walls, sidewalks, stairs, driveways, curbs, gutters, dams, bridges, and tunnels. Cement Finishers must possess a sound knowledge of the properties of various types of concrete and how mixes, proportions, and additives affect concrete strength, setting, curing times, finishes, and durability.

Cement (Concrete) Finisher

A Cement Finisher masters the art of applying various finishes to concrete surfaces such as architectural, exposed, acid-stained, patterned, broomed finish overlays, and smooth finishes. Trainees will be taught to use hand and power tools such as floats and screeds.



Some of the tasks completed by a CCW trainee include constructing and dismantling concrete forms, scaffolding, ramps, catwalks, shoring, and barricades required at construction sites. In addition, they may mix, pour and spread materials such as concrete and asphalt. They may also assist with demolition, removal of rubble and other debris from a site and may operate various power tools, machines, and other equipment as directed.

A Tractor Loader Backhoe Operator inspects, maintains, transports, and operates full (standard) size equipment in the construction and industrial sectors. Some of the duties include performing a pre-operational inspection, transporting equipment, installing attachments, and loading and unloading equipment. In addition, operators will also work on excavating, trenching, grading, stockpiling and backfilling, among other duties.

Asphalt

The Asphalt Worker program provides hands-on training in the placement, spreading, raking, and compaction of asphalt materials. Safety issues pertaining to working with asphalt are also covered including burns, fumes, chemicals, and heat stress. Trainees are introduced to the properties, uses, and mix designs of asphalt and the equipment and tools used in paving operations.





Bridge Construction

In the Bridge Construction program, trainees will learn to construct and install footing forms by establishing starting points. They will also learn to cut and install sideboards, align and support forms, and install spreaders and ties on various structures. The program also includes erecting columns and piers, and building bridge abutments and girders.

Concrete and Drain

In the Concrete and Drain program, trainees will be taught the industry-standard techniques used to install sanitary drainage systems including traps and cleanouts. They will also learn the types of pipes and fittings needed to complete both sanitary and storm sewer systems. Trainees will practice steps for proper grading, concrete pouring and placement, and cement finishing techniques. Work will also include forming of staircases, porches, sills, and the installation of reinforcement steel to strengthen concrete.



Demolition

This program will provide trainees with an overall understanding of the Demolition Sector beginning with the history and development of the sector. An overview of controlled demolition for both conventional and special structures with an emphasis on safety planning and procedures is also included in the course. The program will also provide trainees with a basic understanding of the regulations, tools, equipment, and techniques used throughout this field.

EIFS (Exterior Insulation Finishing Systems)

Upon completion of the program, participants will be familiar with the components of a typical EIFS system and installation process. This includes assessing and preparing substrates, applying membranes and barriers, installing rigid insulation board, applying base coats and reinforcing mesh, and applying finish coats. Participants will also gain familiarity with the tools and materials needed to perform the required tasks as well as practice how to use them safely and efficiently.

GPS Grade Management

Upon completion of the program, participants will understand what goes into jobsite grade management using GPS technology for the Roads and Sewer & Watermain Sectors. Participants will become familiar with the GPS equipment and software (setup and use), understand how the equipment pertains to everyday work and practice troubleshooting commonly encountered problems.

High Rise Forming

Participants will learn about various formwork systems, how to build forms and conduct formwork related calculations, and the principles of concrete. They will gain experience assembling, bracing, and removing forms used for making stairs, landings, slabs, columns and walls. They will also learn how to properly store forms. In addition, they will learn to fly the form table and communicate with the swamper.

High Rise Rodman

In the High Rise Rodman program, trainees will learn to tie columns/cages, walls, and slabs. They will learn to follow the drawings and lay the steel bars and rebar chairs accordingly. Participants will also be learning to cut steel, bend bars (with and without the powerbending tools), and build footings and beams.

High Rise Swamper/Rigger

On a highrise site, the swamper communicates with the crane operator to plan and set up safe lifts onsite. In this program, participants will learn how to safely work with and around cranes and understand the factors that affect crane capacity. They will gain experience making lifts with various types of loads and understand the proper rigging hardware and equipment to use given the shape and the size. Participants will also be exposed to the process of flying forms, as well as practice communicating with the crane operator using proper terminology and accurate distances.

House Framing

The House Framing program allows trainees to build the framework of a two-story home from the ground up. Trainees will learn to build exterior load-bearing walls, interior walls (partitions), floors, roof and learn all appropriate calculations involved when framing a home.

Hydro-Vac Truck

In this 2-day program, participants will learn about proper safety and handling when working with and around hydro-vac trucks.

*This program is ONLY for experienced users/union members that require an update on the proper safety and handling around vac trucks. A company letter will be required to verify a minimum of 1,400 hours of experience.

Landscaping

Participants will develop the knowledge and skills required to be a landscape labourer. This includes tasks such as laying sod, grading and screening, working with tools, setting interlock brick and building retaining walls. Landscapers construct and maintain gardens, parks, golf courses, and other landscape environments. In addition, they also advise clients on issues related to horticulture and landscape construction.

The Low Rise Forming program focuses on building the foundation of residential homes. Trainees will learn the proper procedure to form and pour footings and foundation walls. They will also learn how to set weeping tiles and install waterproofing barriers such as foundation wraps.



Residential Handyperson

The Residential Handyperson program is tailored to suit the needs of those wanting to learn the fundamentals of various trades. Trainees will be exposed to plastering, kitchen fitting, bathroom installation, minor tile replacement, and some basic carpentry. The program will cover taping, caulking, and sanding areas requiring preparation for various treatments such as priming or sealing. Furthermore, the trainee will learn general painting and decorating as part of this program.

Residential Trim

In this program, the trainees will cover various topics such as how to install jambs before the doors or windows can be hung. They will also learn how to install casings and baseboards. Other additional trim work may include wainscoting, chair railings and crown moldings. Participants will also be exposed to skills such as installing locksets, hinges and all of the respective necessary hardware to go with it.



Road Construction

In the Roads Construction program, trainees will learn the key skills required to complete a road project. This includes proper grading techniques to prepare the roadbed and achieve the desired slope. They will also learn how to construct forms for sidewalks and various types of curb designs. Furthermore, they will acquire the skills required to place, level and finish concrete, as well as display various aesthetic finishes. Trainees will also get an opportunity to learn how to set lines and work around a curb machine. Overall, participants will gain a deeper understanding of the sequence of tasks involved in a complete road project and the tools and skills required to complete these tasks.

Sewer and Watermain

In this program, trainees will learn to install PVC sewer and watermain pipes, chambers and concrete pipes. Participants will learn to properly assemble trench boxes (steel boxes and speed shoring) and install fire hydrants and valves. They will also be exposed to other skills such as tapping watermains (PVC and cast).

The Tile Setting program will focus on installing tiles in the Residential Sector. As the industry evolves and new types of adhesives and tiles are used, the demand to train the existing workforce on new materials increases.

Utilities

In the Utilities Program, trainees will acquire the skills to pour and place cable chambers and rebuild existing cable chambers. Trainees will also install duct structures, pole bases and street lighting. This program also teaches them trenching procedures (speed shoring and trenching safety) and how to read locates.



Welding (Day and Evening)

In this program, trainees will learn how to cut steel, and join beams and steel plates together. Participants will also learn how to use torch, fabricate frames and repair machines. Upon completion of the program, trainees will be tested and evaluated by a Canadian Welding Bureau inspector. The test plates are then taken to a lab for further evaluation to determine a passing grade. Members who pass the test will be given a certification card from the Canadian Welding Bureau.

*Occupational hazards in this trade include sparks, gases, hazardous fumes, burns, heavy lifting, exposure to ultra-violet light and infra-red rays, working at heights, working in confined spaces, and in trenches.
